
# Friendships in Early Childhood

New friends may be poems but old friends are alphabets. Don't forget the alphabets because you will need them to read the poems.

Through positive friendships, children cultivate altruism, self esteem and self confidence, enabling them to effectively interact and meet social needs of the self and others. Through interactions, children gain a better understanding of the self which fosters the development of self identity.

The figure below highlights some important skills acquired by children -



#### Friendship Skills Children are Learning


Skill	Example
Patience	When children wait for their turn, take turns and share with others.
Communication	Talk and listen to others.
Empathy	Respond to others' feelings with understanding and take the perspective of others.
Consideration	Say please and thank you, and are helpful to those around them.
Play Skills	Make suggestions for play roles and ideas.
Social Skills	Learn cooperation, communication, empathy, responsibility, and emotional control.

Show children the right way to interact via POSITIVE ROLE MODELLING -


- Organise plenty of opportunities for your child to meet different people.
- O Demonstrate (via your own friends) sharing, listening to others, and taking someone's feelings into account.
  - O Introduce children to new interests (e·g·, clubs, play groups, sports)·

# How fairy tales are a vital aspect of Early Childhood learning?

Albert Einstein: "If you want your children to be intelligent, read them fairy tales. If you want them to be more intelligent, read them more fairy tales."

Fairy tales not only captivate children's imagination but also play an important role in Early Literacy development. They help children creatively explore a range of ideas and lessons on life skills.

The cause and effect of certain actions depicted in fairy tales help children discover the consequences of actions and the impact on other people's feelings.

Children also develop a range of skills -

- Positive problem solving skills (e.g. critical thinking skills).
  - Build resilience by learning how characters overcome challenges:
    - Learn cultural values and behaviours.
      - Creativity.
- Understand the basics of the story (e·g· orientation, conflict resolution, development of characters etc)·
